<b>2</b>	Protecting, maintaining or improving natural resources, to keep them safe from destruction or degradation and conserve them for future generations.	<b>1</b>	A measure of the effect that human activities have on the climate.
<b>6</b>	Destruction of forests to make land for agriculture.	<b>3</b>	A gradual warming of the earth's surface temperature reportedly caused by the emission of gases that trap the sun's heat in the earth's atmosphere.
